First Aid MB: Read the Merit Badge booklet. Assemble a home first aid kit (Req. 2d), and bring it with you to show your class and counselor.

Communications MB: Read the Merit Badge booklet. Do work on your own in order to prepare to complete reqs. 2b, 3 and 9 in the class.

Genealogy MB: Read the Merit Badge booklet. Complete req. 2a or start req. 2b. Complete reqs. 3, 6 and 7 and bring your work with you to class. A pedigree chart and family group record sheets which you can use can be found at: <http://usscouts.org/mb/mb056.asp>

Public Speaking MB: Read the Merit Badge booklet. Prepare a 5 minute speech/presentation (Req. 2) and bring a visual aid with you to assist in your presentation. The aid can be the actual thing you are speaking about, or posters, photographs, charts, etc..)

Indian Lore MB: Obtain the Merit Badge booklet and thoroughly read the section on the Indians of the Northeast. Of course you may read the rest of the book as well.

Computers MB: Thoroughly read the Merit badge booklet, making certain you will be able to discuss the information needed to complete the requirements in class. Please bring a laptop computer if you have one available to you.

Archeology MB: Read the Merit Badge booklet thoroughly and master the contents. Complete reqs. 7, 10, and 11 on your own, and bring your work with you to share with the class.

Family Life MB: Read the Merit Badge booklet. Create a chart of at least 5 chores that you will complete for the next 90 days (Req. 3). A chart you can fill in can be found within the Family Life Merit Badge worksheets at: <http://usscouts.org/mb/worksheets/Family-Life.pdf>

Toten' Chit: Read the section in your Boy Scout Handbook on the use of knife and axe. Bring a folding pocket knife with you if you have one.
